Durham Celebrates New Downtown Parking Garage Construction Completion with March 7 Ribbon-Cutting Ceremony

What: Morgan-Rigsbee Parking Garage Ribbon-Cutting Ceremony

Who: City of Durham Transportation Department Park Durham Division

When: Thursday, March 7, 2019, beginning at 10 a.m.

Fast Facts:

- This new downtown mixed-use parking garage, located at the intersections of Morgan Street, Mangum Street and Rigsbee Avenue, is now ready to open to the public on Monday, March 11.
- This ribbon-cutting ceremony celebrates the completion of this \$23 million project, which provides 667 new parking spaces in downtown Durham, of which 145 will be dedicated as new hourly parking spaces. Hourly parking will be available beginning on Monday, with monthly parking being provided later this month once technology installation for access cards is complete.
- This parking garage also houses 15,687 square feet of new commercial/retail space now available for lease and 4,750 square feet of new office space for the Transportation Department's Park Durham Division.
- Event speakers include Mayor Steve Schewel, Deputy City Manager Keith Chadwell, and Chief Parking Administrator Thomas Leathers. Light refreshments will also be served along with tours of the new commercial/retail space and the new Park Durham offices.
