Durham Parks and Recreation Hosts Egg Hunts

Eggs-perts Hunt for Eggs in March

Durham, NC: In March, residents will have the opportunity to put all of their eggs in one basket at Durham Parks and Recreation's [Annual Egg Hunts](#).

Participants can pick-up supplies to enjoy an Egg Hunt at home or attend one of the socially distanced in-person events. All events are free, and pre-registration is required. Parents and guardians attending the in-person events must pre-register as well.

Residents interested in hosting an [at-home egg hunt](#) can pick up supplies at the Campus Hills Recreation Center (2000 S. Alston Avenue) on March 25 from 5 p.m. – 7 p.m. This inclusive program is for children of all ability levels ages 12 and under. Participants will receive an email with pick up instructions on March 23.

On March 27, egg-citement will be in the air at the Egg Hunts scheduled at [West Point on the Eno](#) (5101 N. Roxboro Road) and [Leigh Farm Park](#) (370 Leigh Farm Road) from 10 a.m. – 4 p.m. At each event, an egg hunt will begin every hour at the top of the hour. Those who find the golden egg will win a special prize, and participants 12 and under will receive a take-home activity bag. Face masks are required for all participants ages two and older.

Also on Saturday, March 27, residents and their canine friends are invited to attend the [Dog-Gone Egg Hunts](#) at West Point on the Eno. Participants can select from two timeslots at either 10:30 a.m.-11 a.m. or 1:30 p.m.-2 p.m. Canines must meet the minimum vaccination requirements of [Durham's Dog Parks](#). Non-Dog Park members are allowed but must show proof of vaccination in advance or on the day of the event. You must bring a basket.
